You will apply extensive experience in community work along with your knowledge of aboriginal studies, social sciences and community development and be "hands on" in the daily implementation of our work. You will have extensive experience in project and control management, budget development and community relations and will have managed complex projects. You will provide advice and support to the team in the development and success of the aboriginal engagement program.

The successful candidate must be willing to learn, to take initiative, to be able to communicate clearly, plan and organize well, to trouble-shoot and problem solve. Other personal skills include the ability to work effectively in a team environment and independently, and a "can do" attitude with a track record of leadership and success in varied endeavors.

## Qualifications:

- 4 year university education in aboriginal studies, environmental studies, public policy development/administration, and/or sociology or by having the equivalent education.
- Over 6 years and up to and including 8 years is considered necessary to gain this experience.
- Knowledge of community development, public engagement and public policy and understanding of Indigenous organizational structure and culture in Canada and Indigenous consultation.

- Public engagement and aboriginal relations experience on projects involving multiple interests.
- Have proven organizational skills, be a self-starter who can work independently and in a team environment that is dedicated to excellence.
- Demonstrated background in working with the general public and Indigenous people in a variety of settings with increasing level of complexity in relationships.
- Have demonstrated financial and project management skills in planning and executing project activities.
- Have an ability to be flexible, and meet new challenges as arise, in a demanding and dynamic environment.
- Preference will be given to applicants with an understanding of Indigenous communities and culture in Northern Ontario.
- Preference will be given to applicants resident in Northern Ontario or willing to re-locate.
- This position will require frequent travel within assigned region.
- This successful candidate must locate in the area and be prepared to travel frequently.

You must be eligible to work in Canada and must be able to meet security clearance requirements.
