## **Graphic Designer – (Temporary 1 Year Term)**

We are currently seeking an experienced Graphic Designer to join our energetic and fast-paced Stakeholder Relations team. Reporting to our Multimedia Communications Supervisor at our Toronto headquarters, the successful candidate would be responsible for planning and executing graphic design for corporate communication materials.

## Responsibilities:

Working in accordance with prescribed safety procedures and regulations, provide graphic design services for internal clients.

- 1. Meet and interact with internal clients to gather relevant information and determine graphic needs including the message the design should portray and its intended appeal, deadlines and approvals required. Based on the briefing(s), by consulting with the Multimedia Communications Supervisor and performing independent research, as necessary, plan and execute designs for the target audience.
- 2. Develop the overall layout and production design of NWMO corporate communication material including newsletters, annual and corporate reports, advertisement, signs and signage, displays and premium items consistent with brand and visual identity standards. Consult with writers on any text (English and French) that accompanies the design. Work with other department staff to coordinate with printers in the production of communications materials. Review printer proofs to ensure alignment with designs before the final print run.
- 3. Develop and support the design aspects of NWMO web page changes. Develop, source and update images (infographics, diagrams, photographs, etc.) for display on web pages. Develop graphics for interactive media and multimedia projects, and create graphs and charts from data for use in NWMO communications. Develop videos and animations for social media. Support design requirements associated with NWMO corporate events and engagement activities (invitations and attendee materials, presentations/visuals).

- 4. Work with other department staff to establish and maintain NWMO's photo library. Ensure photographs are catalogued and filed correctly.
- 5. Keep abreast of best practices in graphic design and video.
- 6. Attend meetings to review and discuss the status of projects, work plan updates and to discuss and clarify project requirements and production schedules.
- 7. Perform other duties as required.

## **Education & Experience:**

- 3 year college diploma in graphic design, visual arts or a related field.
- Experience in graphic design, visual arts or a related field.
- Advanced skills in Adobe CS6 Suite or CC primarily in Illustrator, Photoshop and InDesign (Premiere, After Effects an asset).
- Knowledge of best practices in graphic design, print and video.
- Able to understand and consistently execute brand and visual identity standards.
- Advanced skills in Microsoft Power Point.
- Able to manage competing priorities under pressure within tight timeframes.
- Outstanding attention to detail.
- Knowledge of graphic design and printing processes to help manage production of publications.
- Basic knowledge in HTML, CSS and Content Management such as Wordpress.
- Strong photography skills would be an asset.
- Experience shooting/editing video footage and developing animated videos would be an asset.
- An ability to conceptualize easily, learn quickly and demonstrate initiative in developing communications materials.
- Ability to develop and maintain positive relationships with a wide variety of internal stakeholders.
