

6.1 Quarterly monitoring and associated activities

For the purposes of conducting quarterly pressure monitoring and water sampling during the Term, NWMO may:

- a. Place a trailer containing testing and sampling equipment at the site,
 - b. Retain the drill pad,
 - c. Add a 3 m X 3 m X 0.1 m thick concrete pad around the well head to provide a stable base for the enclosure and setup of testing equipment,
 - d. Construct an enclosure to protect external instruments and monitoring connections, approximately 1.2 m X 1.2 m X 1.2 m in size,
 - e. Install a solar panel to recharge batteries to power data transfer equipment, and
 - f. Retain the fencing referred to in Section 2 b) of this Appendix B for the duration of the monitoring.
4. Section 7 of Appendix B – Borehole Drilling Project Description and Conditions to the Borehole Project #1 Permission Agreement is amended by adding the following at the end of the first paragraph:
- In any case, NWMO shall remove all equipment and materials, including fencing, within 30 days of the conclusion of the monitoring and associated activities described in Section 6.1 of this Appendix B.
5. Section 8 of Appendix B – Borehole Drilling Project Description and Conditions to the Borehole Project #1 Permission Agreement is amended by deleting “6 months” and replacing it with “5 years”.
