Third Submission of Comments to NWMO Regarding Discussion Document 1

Further to the submissions sent on January 29 and April 21, 2004, I would like to provide further comments on NMWO's first discussion document.

I have enclosed an article¹⁾ by Dr. Zbigniew Jaworowski, a renowned scientist. It provides us the very important lessons he received from his personal experience during the Chernobyl disaster, which started on April 26, 1986. In this article, Dr. Jaworowski explains the actual risks from the radiation exposures and the very inappropriate actions that were taken by the authorities.

I have also enclosed the epilogue from *CREATING THE NEW WORLD: Stories & Images from the Dawn of the Atomic Age*²⁾ by Dr. Theodore Rockwell. "The public has been told so many things about nuclear energy that are confusing or just plain wrong, that some of the basic physical facts should be clarified. The best way to do this was invented over 2000 years ago by the philosopher Socrates." Dr. Rockwell put this discussion into the form of questions by Socrates, which are answered by a metaphorical Dr. Proh, who sees no serious problems with nuclear technology, and Dr. Kahn, who feels the problems outweigh the advantages.
