Implementing Adaptive Phased Management 2010 to 2014

DRAFT FOR REVIEW

1. The draft Plan is built around seven strategic objectives. Are the objectives that we have identified appropriate? Have we missed key areas?

One objective should be to identify a means of transportation which is acceptable to Canadians. It would be useless to have a single deep geological repository in Canada if the waste cannot be transported to it.

2. The draft Plan identifies work and activities we propose to undertake to accomplish these objectives. Have we set out appropriate activities? *Looks reasonable.*

4. (cont'd) The following statement in the glossary will alarm most Canadians: "For practical purposes some hazards remain for an indefinite period". The risk associated with the waste after 100 or 200 years of storage should be compared to something more meaningful.

3. What more would you like to know about the NWMO's implementation plan?

Have you considered using the deep geological repository to store contaminated equipment from decommissioned nuclear plants?

4. Other comments?

One gets the impression that the waste disposal site will likely be on land under the control of a original peoples because they are the only subgroup of Canadians singled out in the plan.
