# Nuclear Waste Management Organization and Township of Ignace

# **Community Survey Report**


In January 2021, a survey was mailed to 850 Ignace community households. The purpose of the survey was to understand the Nuclear around awareness Waste Management Organization (NWMO) and the site selection community, as well the as information about the level of community interest in learning about the findings of the various studies and topics. The survey was available in paper, telephone, and online formats, and responses were collected through April 2, 2021. A total of 225 residents completed the survey through one of these methods.





#### AWARENESS, FAMILIARITY, & KNOWLEDGE



Almost all survey respondents (98%) indicated that they had heard of the Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) prior to receiving the survey.


The large majority of respondents (92%) were very familiar or somewhat familiar with the involvement of Ignace in the site selection process for a deep geological repository for the long-term management of Canada's used nuclear fuel.





The majority of responding Ignace residents (58%) indicated that they were familiar with the local Indigenous communities' involvement in the site selection process for the deep geological repository.

#### SITE SELECTION



Most survey respondents (87%) indicated that they were aware that the project will only be implemented with the involvement of an informed and willing host.

Ignace residents responding to the survey were asked to select their preferred method for being kept informed and sharing their thoughts about the project. The most commonly reported communication method was Newsletters (59%), followed by Township website (Ignace.ca) (44%), Letter mail (38%), and Social Media (33%).






#### INTEREST IN STUDIES AND TOPICS

Ignace residents responding to the survey were asked to indicate their level of interest in learning about the findings of various studies and topics. Overall, combined "Very Interested" + "Somewhat Interested" was high for all items (88%-97%).

The studies and topics with the highest "Very Interested" results were, the environment (including water, soil, wildlife, and air at surface and nearsurface) (82%), followed by the impact on property values (80%), social, health and public infrastructure (79%), and safety assessments (78%).

#### **OTHER COMMENTS**

Survey respondents were also given the opportunity to provide an open-ended response about any additional information they wanted to receive from NWMO. In total, 66 (29%) of responding Ignace residents provided a comment which conveyed a variety of responses and questions. Where a common pattern existed (at least 5 comments of a similar nature), comments were grouped into the following themes\*. Overall, some respondents asked that NWMO keep residents informed in general (n=14), while many indicated they would like to receive more information on:

- How the security of the site, and safety of the community would be maintained (n=15)
- Impacts on local traffic and infrastructure (n=9)
- Community involvement in the decision-making process (n=8)
- Effects on the local economy (n=7)
- Impacts on the local community and residents (n=5)

\*Comments can be included in more than one theme where more than one idea was presented.
